ORAL PRESENTATION

- There is a 1 hour "Mini-symposium" included in the programme for oral presentations.
- Preference will be given to trainees for this session.
- The symposium will include 4 presentations each lasting 15 minutes (10 minutes presentation followed by 5 minutes discussion) and will be chaired by an expert panel comprising of a rheumatologist, a microbiologist and an infectious diseases physician.
- There will be a £200 prize for the best oral presentation based on relevance, presentation style and educational value
- Presenters will get the following certificates:
 - 1. "Certificate of attendance"
 - 2. "Certificate of presentation"
 - 3. "Best presenter certificate" (this will be given to the best presenter chosen by the panel)

POSTER PRESENTATION

- Click on "Submit Your Abstract"
- Register with the abstract administration system
- Submit your abstract, ensuring that all fields are completed accurately (main body of abstract limited to 250 words maximum)

Abstracts should state briefly and clearly the purpose, methods, results and conclusions of the work. These will be selected for oral or poster presentations
